As an international student you have to make financial arrangements before leaving your home country. In Germany you can apply to performance-based scholarship programmes and, depending on your nationality, to a student loan. Student jobs are a very good option to earn some extra money and gain valuable work experience during your studies.

STUDY LOANS | EU nationality is required

— FINS Student loan | EU nationality is required:

FINS offers student loans to both undergraduate and postgraduate european students that want to study at a university in the European Union. Students get a customised loan offer based on their budget and are able to access up to EUR 25,000 (in instalments or as needed) for a Bachelor's or a Master's degree. Students must have a clean financial record but do not need any earnings, physical guarantees or mortgages.

The repayment period starts 6 - 12 months after you have finished your studies. FINS loans have an interest rate between 9.5% and 12.5% during your studies, during the grace period, and in the first 6 months of the repayment period. Starting with the 7th month of the repayment period, you can benefit from a reduced interest rate of 9%. The repayment periods are 5 years for Master's graduates and 10 years for Bachelor's graduates. There are no extra costs if you can pay off the loan earlier.

SRH EDUCATION FUNDS | EU nationality is required

A fair financial solution where repayments are based on your income. The SRH Education Funds with Brain Capital and Chancen's Income Share Agreements (ISA) ensure equal access to education with a fair financial solution, irrespective of your current financial status. Main principle is "solidarity community": "Top earners" take on less successful sponsors so that future generations can continue to use the funding.

— Brain Capital | EU nationality is required:

Study first, pay later: the Next Generation Contract is an innovative model designed to finance your education. With this model, every qualified applicant can study at their preferred university without paying tuition. Brain Capital was founded in 2005 and is one of the largest providers of education funds.

OTHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMMES | For all nationalities

There are several political and religious foundations in Germany that offer scholarships based on criteria such as academic performance and social/political commitment.

DAAD Scholarship Programmes:

Every year, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) supports well over 100,000 students and researchers around the globe. DAAD scholarships are aimed primarily at graduates and are awarded for study and research visits to universities and non-university research institutions in Germany. In some programmes, internships are also funded. You can find information on the various types of scholarships in the DAAD scholarship database.

Heinrich Böll Foundation Scholarships:

Every year, the Heinrich Böll Foundation awards approximately 1,200 scholarships to ambitious students, graduates and doctoral candidates of all disciplines and nationalities. Scholarship recipients are expected to show outstanding academic performance and political and social commitment, with an interest in values such as ecology, sustainability, democracy, human rights, self-determination and justice.

Students from non-EU countries receive €850 per month as part of their Master's degree, in addition to individual allowances. EU students with the same level of study receive €649 plus €300 book allowance per month. The scholarship is awarded for the standard period of study with the possibility of extending it by one semester.

- Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung Scholarships:

This programme promote foreign students who have successfully completed their undergraduate studies in their home country. Students with above average academic achievements with a keen interest in politics are eligible to apply for the Konrad-Adenauer-Stiftung Scholarship.

Master students will receive an amount of 850€ monthly for two years. Tuition fees can be reimbursed up to 500€ per semester. Through these scholarships, intercultural dialogues and international networks get promoted in order to develop the relations between the home countries and Germany.

— The Friedrich Ebert Stiftung Scholarship:

The Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung scholarship is available for foreign applicants who are studying in Germany at a state or state-recognized university of applied sciences. These students are expected to have above-average academic achievements.

To be eligible for this scholarship you must demonstrate exceptional German language skills even if the course you are taking is in English. The places are limited since only 40 people per year. Scholarship holders in Bachelor programmes will receive a monthly amount of 830€. Those in master programmes will receive 850€ per month as well as health insurance costs.

DISCOUNTS ON TUITION FEES | For all nationalities

Advanced Payment Option: If you pay your regular tuition fees for two semesters (one year) in advance, we will give you a discount of 3% on the total sum of the regular tuition fee. If you pay your entire regular tuition fees in advance, we will grant you a 5% discount on the total amount of regular tuition fees. The discount does not apply to the enrolment fee, the transportation ticket and additional fees that are due for some Master and MBA programmes according to the payment regulations of the study contract.

Siblings, spouses and registered civil partners: Siblings, spouses and registered civil partners get a discount of 10% on the regular tuition fee that have to be paid.

Graduates of SRH Berlin University of Applied Sciences: If you are a Bachelor graduate from our schools and you enrol in one of our Master programmes, you will receive a discount of 10% on the regular tuition fee amount.

STUDENT JOBS | For all nationalities

A student job is a great way to earn money to finance your studies and to gain valuable work experience. According to the German Residence Act non-EU/EEA students are allowed to work 120 full days or 240 half-days per calendar year. Freelance work is not permitted. It is possible to be employed as a working student for up to 20 hours/week during the semester and up to 40 hours/week during the semester break. German skills make the job search considerably easier. Our Career Service can support you with the job search.
